

## **Candidate bios for 2020 SHMA board election**

Three seats need to be filled, each for a three-year term.  
We thank Louise Yorio for her service. She is stepping down.

**Chuck Burton** moved to the Manor in September of last year with his husband Nick and 1-year-old daughter Alex, all of whom quickly rose to local news stardom after a very large oak tree fell around two sides of their house 1 month after arriving. Stirred by the generosity, wisdom, and support provided by fellow SHM residents after the tree's fall, Chuck is running for a seat on the board to pay it forward.

When not jogging (rather slowly) around the neighborhood and fulfilling swing-pushing responsibilities, Chuck splits his time working as an Associate Research Scientist at the Yale School of Public Health and as a practicing clinical psychologist. Chuck has dedicated much of his career to civil service and has worked in research or clinical capacities for the U.S. Air Force, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and the New York State Office of Mental Health. After having two daughters (now 8 and 10) they choose their new house on Hemlock Drive for the quiet setting, beautiful surroundings, and extra bathrooms!

Andrew started his professional life in education working first as a teacher of technology and mathematic before become a technology director and then later a director of operations for an independent school. Six years ago he made the decision to really follow his dream by opening a home improvement business and is now known locally as Handy Andy.

Andrew sits on the Executive Board as Treasurer for the Sleepy Hollow Tarrytown Chamber of Commerce and last year also took on a Board position with the Foundation for the Public Schools of the Tarrytowns.

**Jay Schulz** is a native of Wisconsin, but moved to Sleepy Hollow Manor 20 years ago, and never regrets it because he loves this neighborhood. He has been on the SHMA board for the past 10 years, and has served as President for the past 2 years.

**Alfred A. Strasser's** nickname is Fredi, but in his professional life is known as Al. He is married to Laurie Wilson, a psychoanalyst and art historian and has a son, Chris, from a previous marriage, with a grandson Wolfie living in Oakland CA. He moved in to 17 Pokahoe Drive in 1996, but moved to Westchester before that, having been born originally in Budapest, Hungary.

In his spare time he has engaged in tennis, skiing, mountain climbing, swimming and is a lover of classical music, sings and is on the Board of the Hudson Chorale.

Professionally he is President of Aquarius Services Corporation, Sleepy Hollow, (a one man company) formed in 1995 to continue consulting services to nuclear utilities and organizations that regulate them, but is now mostly retired. Previously, after 22 years, he retired as President from the S.M. Stoller Corp. in 1994, that consulted with nuclear utilities and operated hazardous material cleanup projects.

Prior to Stoller, Mr. Strasser worked 18 years for the United Nuclear Corp. starting in 1954 with its predecessor the Nuclear Development Corp., White Plains, NY and ending with Gulf United Nuclear Corp., Elmsford, NY. Initially as Manager of the Materials Section he was responsible for the materials design of reactor components and subsequently was Manager of the Plutonium Fuels Department responsible for their development.

Before starting in the nuclear field Mr. Strasser worked for the US Air Force and the M.W. Kellogg Corp. on materials technology related to gas turbines, air frames, rockets, chemical and fossil fuel plants.

Mr. Strasser has degrees in metallurgy from Purdue University and Stevens Institute of Technology.

**Daphne Uviller** has lived in the Manor with her husband (conservation ecologist Sacha Spector), two kids (quaranteen Talia and thankfully-still-12-years-old Gabriel), and dog (Agent Poppypeed) since 2016. She has joyfully served on the SHMA board since 2017.
